About the Facilitator:

Abby Cooper has consulted on Competitive Integrated Employment (CIE) and Customized Employment nationally and internationally. She has provided Technical Assistance (TA) and training on CIE in 40 states and provided Technical Assistance to the South Korean government on the structures and policies needed to be in place to provide CIE. Her leadership transformed a Day Activity Center into the first Supported Employment (SE) agency and Center for Independent Living in Washington State. Abby has provided technical assistance on an array of policy issues such as Waiver funding, Memorandum of Understandings, the transformation from 14(c), Self-Employment, Customized Employment, State as a Model Employer, and capacity building. As a Statewide Administrator for the Washington State Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR),



Abby secured federal funding for a five-year Informed Choice grant she designed and administered. Abby started the first program in the nation that provided benefits planning and financial literacy to VR clients and created Individual Development Accounts (IDAs) with Ticket-to-Work dollars for DVR customers.

Since 2014 she has worked as a subject matter expert for Economic Systems under a contract with the Office of Disability Employment Policy. In 2021 Abby worked with organizations in Ohio to expand community inclusion and to rethink community residential support. She currently works on the National Expansion of Employment Opportunities Network (NEON), focusing on Community Inclusion, employer outreach, and establishing networks between community providers through an online Community of Practice.
