

FEMA Providing \$405M to Emergency Managers

Today, FEMA released the funding notice for the Emergency Management Performance Grant program, making \$405.1 million available to assist state, local, tribal and territorial governments in developing their emergency management capabilities and for all-hazards preparedness activities.

The program focuses on planning, operations, equipment acquisitions, training, exercises, construction and renovation.

This is one of the highest ever annual amounts awarded for this grant, because of the combined release of \$355.1 million through [annual appropriations](#) and an additional \$50 million in funding through the “[Disaster Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act](#).”

This application period opens at 2 p.m. ET on Wednesday, April 13 and closes at 5 p.m. ET on Monday, June 13.

Eligible applicants must submit an initial application by June 6, through the [Grants.gov](#). FEMA will notify eligible applicants to proceed with submitting their complete application package in the [Non-Disaster \(ND\) Grants System](#) by the application deadline.

FEMA anticipates that all awards will be made no later than Sept. 30. Award amounts for each government entity are predetermined and based on the “[Post-Katrina Emergency Management Reform Act of 2006](#),” All 50 states, the District of Columbia, and the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico receive a base amount of 0.75% of the total available funding appropriated for the program. Four territories, American Samoa, Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, and the U.S. Virgin Islands, receive a base amount of 0.25% of the total available funding appropriated. The remaining balance of funds are distributed on a population-share basis.
