

NEW MOTOR VOTER

WHAT DOES IT MEAN FOR YOU?



Oregon's new Motor Voter law will begin by January 1, 2016. This will affect many Oregonians with disabilities who never registered to vote before. If you or your family member receive the card, here are answers to some questions you might have.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

If you have an Oregon Identification Card (ID) or Driver's license, you will be automatically registered to vote. You will receive a card in the mail giving you choices.

See below for a list of options for what to do next! Don't forget - It's your choice!

Option A

You do nothing



You are registered to vote as Not a Member of a Party

Option B

Opt out of registering within 3 weeks



You are not registered to vote

Option C

Respond to choose a political party



You are registered in that party

Option D

Cancel your registration at any time



You are not registered to vote
